HUMANITARIAN RESPONSE

Project “Humanitarian and Social Support for Families of Fallen, Missing, and Captive Persons”

1,580 families in Dnipro and Kharkiv regions received food vouchers with the support of the Regional Unit of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

Implementation period: January–December 2025



Food packages for families of children with disabilities “Restless Hearts” in Dnipro, implemented in partnership with the NGO Eleos-Dnipro.

38 families of children with disabilities in Dnipro received food and hygiene kits.

Implementation period: April 2025

Project “Humanitarian Support for Internally Displaced Persons in Dnipropetrovsk Oblast”

500 IDP families in Dnipro received food packages with the support of GlobalMedic and Johanniter Mission Siret.

Implementation period: October–November 2025



Project “Humanitarian Support for Vulnerable Households: Home Insulation”

350 war-affected families received home insulation kits in Dnipropetrovsk and Kharkiv oblasts with the support of the Regional Unit of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

Implementation period: December 2025 – April 2026



Reintegration of Veterans, Women Veterans, and Their Family Members

Project “Reintegration of War Veterans and Women Veterans through Educational Opportunities: ‘One Plus One,’” implemented in partnership with DVV International in Ukraine with the support of the Federal Foreign Office of Germany.

“Opportunities Map for Veterans, Women Veterans, and Their Family Members”

A study was conducted, existing services were mapped, and an analytical report was produced.

45 participants completed certified professional training courses: “Basics of Accounting,” “Massage Basics,” and “Nail Services.”



30 participants took part in business schools and received mentoring support.



More than 300 persons received career, professional, and psychological group and individual consultations, as well as mentoring support.

6 grants of UAH 400,000 each

provided for starting and developing businesses in the following areas:

- farming
- plant cultivation and sales
- rehabilitation services
- catering services
- manufacturing
- engineering services

Implementation period: June 2025 – February 2026





Reintegration of Veterans, Women Veterans, and Their Family Members

Forum of Ideas and Opportunities for Veterans, Women Veterans, and Their Family Members. Chernivtsi

The “Public Resources and Initiatives” Charity Foundation, in partnership with DVV International, organized a cross-sectoral forum dedicated to education, employment, and the reintegration of veterans and their family members. The study “Opportunities Map for Veterans, Women Veterans, and Their Family Members in Chernivtsi Oblast” was presented, and a priority support model was agreed upon.

VETERANS RESTART 2025 Forum. Kyiv

- The Foundation was invited as a practitioner organization to present regional experience in the reintegration of veterans and their family members.
- A scalable regional model within the project “One Plus One” (education → mentoring → employment) was presented as a good practice example.
- Key findings and lessons learned were highlighted, including the effectiveness of short, practice-oriented programs, the importance of family support, and intersectoral coordination.
- Participation strengthened the Foundation’s expert presence at the national level and increased the potential for replicating the model in other regions of Ukraine.



Roundtable “Implementation of Humanitarian Policy for the Reintegration of War Veterans into Social Life”

A practical veteran reintegration model – “education → mentoring → employment/business” – was presented as a unified support pathway.





Children and Youth Development

Project “Shelters for Treasures”

Four child-friendly shelters in Dnipropetrovsk Oblast (Nikopol, Synelnykove, and Kryvyi Rih districts) were equipped with furniture, equipment, learning and leisure materials, fire extinguishers, and warm blankets, with the support of the Regional Unit of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

200 children gained access to comfortable and psychologically supportive spaces during air raid alerts.

Implementation period: June–August 2025



“Give Kindness. Children to Children”

3,750 children from IDP families, as well as families of fallen/deceased, missing, and captive persons, received gifts for St. Nicholas Day, Christmas, and New Year. The campaign was implemented in partnership with the NGO “Eleos Dnipro.”

500 children's books were donated to children with the support of the A-BA-BA-HA-LA-MA-HA publishing house as a contribution to promoting reading and emotional recovery.

Institutional Capacity Strengthening of the Foundation

Project “Institutional Capacity Strengthening of the ‘Public Resources and Initiatives’ Charity Foundation”

with technical support from UN Women in Ukraine and funding from the Women’s Peace and Humanitarian Fund (WPHF).

Implementation period: October 2025 – April 2026

Strategic Planning:

a strategic session was conducted with the participation of teams from different regions; the Foundation’s strategic priorities, development logic, and internal coordination were refined.



Internal Policies Update:

key organizational policies (governance, ethical, safeguarding, and gender-responsive) were reviewed and updated, strengthening accountability, transparency, and compliance with international humanitarian standards.



Team Mental Health:

a series of trainings and group activities on psycho-emotional support were organized for 25 staff members and volunteers from different regions of the Foundation’s operations, strengthening team resilience and self-regulation skills under prolonged stress.



Strengthening the Material and Technical Base:

technical equipment and working tools of the organization were upgraded, improving operational efficiency, data security, and the quality of internal processes.



- November 2025 – The NGO “Sphere of Youth” (Chernihiv) joined the network.


Strategic Planning:

Coordination of Humanitarian Programs:

Common priorities were defined, and interregional coordination of humanitarian, youth, and educational initiatives was established.

“ZHURT-UA” strengthened the institutional capacity of its members and became a stable platform for interregional cooperation and joint responses to humanitarian challenges.




